

## CALL FOR NOMINATIONS – EXTENDED DEADLINE DUE FEBRUARY 15, 2021

## ARCS EMERGING SUSTAINABILITY SCHOLAR AWARD

The ARCS Emerging Sustainability Scholar Award recognizes a junior scholar in the area of corporate sustainability who is likely to make significant contributions to the advancement of corporate sustainability scholarship. The award will be granted in recognition of a scholar's existing body of research and in anticipation of future work, given the scholar's research trajectory. The selection committee will look for candidates with rigorous and salient contributions that cross disciplinary and national boundaries and have demonstrated or have the potential to demonstrate impact on practice. The award winner must have no more than five years on the tenure clock (e.g., not taking into consideration years faculty may have taken maternity, paternity or sick leave, or who may have spent time doing prosocial non-academic service). To submit a nomination, please fill out this form.

Anyone is welcome to nominate suitable candidates. Self-nominations are also acceptable. Nominations for the award should be accompanied by a motivation letter explaining why and how the nominee meets the award criteria. In addition, nominations should include a recent curriculum vitae of the nominee. Nominations are due by February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. The awardee will be informed by March 15<sup>th</sup> and will receive a USD\$1,000.00 cash prize.

The award winner will be recognized at the annual <u>ARCS Conference</u>, to be held June 21-24, 2021. At the conference, the winner will be asked to give a 10-minute presentation (<u>TED-style</u>) to share their research agenda and to articulate a "big idea" for advancing scholarship in the domain of corporate sustainability.
